FROM THE RABBI

WHY BE JEWISH?

You shall not oppress a stranger, for you know the feelings of the stranger, having yourselves been strangers in the land of Egypt. Exodus 23.9

Recently, the question came up: Does B'nai Sholom want to support just causes as a congregation? The Religious Action Center (Reform Judaism's social justice organization) called to ask if I would support expansion of WV law to include protection for Lesbian, Gay, Bi-Sexual and Transgender (LGBT) people in regard to housing and employment. They wanted me to write a letter to the local paper, preferably with a Christian colleague, stating religiously-based reasons for this support. I was glad to do it. The Board was glad for me to do it. We agreed that I would not speak for the entire congregation as we don't know how the entire congregation thinks on this or any issue. Reverend Rick Wilson and I wrote an opinion piece for the Herald-Dispatch that was printed March 18, and we were guests on Jean Dean's radio show that week as well. As it turned out, the WV House committee did not pass the new legislation this session. Still, we have been given an opportunity.

This experience gives us the chance to ask ourselves the question: Do we as a congregation want to be involved in justice issues? I thought it was basic to Judaism (See above quote from Torah). I thought the whole Passover seder was meant to inspire us to increase justice in the world, within the constraints of reality. It turns out that it may be more complicated than that. For one thing, I carelessly set myself up in opposition to the board in last month's newsletter article. That was a mistake born of my nascent passion on the subject and relative inexperience as a rabbi. It is not up to me to ram anything through. After all, B'nai Sholom was here long before I was and – if we all do our part – will be here long after I am gone. A rabbi has a certain amount of influence on the life of a congregation, but the congregation is bigger than the rabbi. Also, my natural talents are not in community organizing, except insofar as that is accomplished by learning and worshiping together.

In Friday night services lately I've been asking the questions: What is it about Judaism that is compelling for you? Why are you Jewish? Whatever it is, is it compelling enough to convince the next generation to be Jewish? I have been getting some responses, which I plan to fashion into a High Holy Day sermon. Each week I have been offering another of my favorite things about Judaism. These are the things that made me decide to become a rabbi so I could spread my enthusiasm for Judaism around. One of them is the idea that we are here to make the world a better place, not only for ourselves and our families, but for the rest of humanity as well.

What is most important to you about being Jewish? Do the ethical imperatives of *tzedakah* (righteous giving) and *tikkun olam* (repair of the world) resonate with you? Or, do those things take a back seat to some other aspect of Judaism? Please let me know – call me, write me, email me, come see me. And come to the Congregational Meeting next month. If we decide social justice is important to us, we'll be prepared to act on it next time the opportunity arises.





EMPTY BOWLS PROJECT



The *Empty Bowls* offers guests who contribute \$12, a generous portion of soup donated by area restaurants, and served in a unique ceramic bowl, handmade by a student in Marshall's Keramos Student Pottery Guild.

The bowl is yours to take home as a lasting reminder of the hunger that so many in our region regularly face.

This year's event will be Friday, April 19, 2013 at the First Presbyterian Church, 10:30 AM to 2:00 PM.

There is also an opportunity to bid on dozens of items at a SILENT AUCTION.

Last year, the nearly 1,000 people in attendance at *Empty Bowls* had the opportunity to bid on dozens of items, including gift baskets from local businesses, sports memorabilia autographed by Marshall athletes and coaches, and a two night all inclusive trip to the General Lewis Inn located in Lewisburg, WV.

Last year's lunch and the auction raised nearly \$18,500, with all proceeds going to the Huntington Area Food Bank (HAFB) – a nonprofit food distribution center that provides food to soup kitchens, emergency relief shelters and other hunger relief programs throughout the Tri-State.

Each dollar donated at Empty Bowls enables the Food Bank to distribute seven pounds of food to the hungry in our region. Every \$12 donation – the price of your special lunch – will feed an entire family for three weeks.

As partners in this important project, B'nai Sholom Congregation has assumed responsibility for obtaining items for the SILENT AUCTION. This will involve contacting local businesses and local attractions for donations.






