## FROM THE RABBI

Many great scholars have opined that the story of Jewish history, of the Jewish people, is a continuing cycle of destruction--and rebirth; an endless cycle of exile--and redemption, of enslavement--and of liberation. We see these themes with special clarity, at this season of the year. We celebrate the season of Passover, the great saga of our journey from slavery in Egypt, to the parting of the Red Sea, to the eventual establishment of a Jewish Kingdom in the land of Israel.

We see this theme again, later this month, when we mark with sadness the season of "Holocaust Remembrance"--and then, shortly after, the celebration of Israel's Independence Day. Again the theme: destruction to rebirth, from enslavement to freedom--freedom to live a meaningful, authentic Jewish life! But what, in the 21st century, do we mean by "an authentic Jewish life?" According to one scholar:

"The living of an authentic Jewish existence is not to be defined by where it is lived. What matters is how. By "authentic" and "Jewish" one may mean many things. To me an authentic Jewish life is one of joy and gladness, a life that fulfills the many-splendored hopes of humanity with the light of Torah. And Torah illumines the world, no one part more than another. American Jews will have attained an "authentic Jewish life" when they look forward to Sabbaths of contentment and festivals of rejoicing, when they celebrate natural glories and share the human pathos, when they have so educated themselves that whatever happens enters into Torah and also explains its meaning."

Quite a challenge for us to attain! And I especially like the emphasis on joy and gladness, on the Sabbath and the festivals. But how shall we achieve this state of joy? For me, it is through our prayer services and through study; but for others, there needs to be a different path. The question remains, and especially at this season of the year: how do we make our personal journey from exile to redemption?

We might ponder the words of Rabbi Jacob Neusner:

"The end of our exile--and the exile of Jews wherever they may be--will come with the end of alienation, disintegration, and inner strife. On that distant day we shall be at one with ourselves, at one in society, and at one with God. We will know the joy of Torah in the private life and for the public interest, and Torah shall open the way to God. And the first step on that long, long road is the start of the search for the joys of being Jewish--trivial, humble pleasures, such as welcoming the sunset on the eve of the Seventh Day and singing songs about the Lord, master of the world, rock of whose goodness we have eaten, the honored Day. Song without belief, to be sure; but the song contains all the belief we need! Our voices, our words, our melodies--these resonate as one--the echo of our ultimate unity, the end of our exile from ourselves, the beginning of the inner peace we seek."

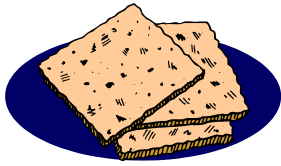
A wonderful goal: to find this inner peace, this harmony, the end of exile, the ultimate unity--and to find it, more than anywhere, through our observance (with joy!) of the Sabbath, our "honored Day," with song and prayer. I hope you will join me in this search, on the Sabbaths to come this Spring, and for many weeks after that as well.

#### ***Trip to Israel Program***

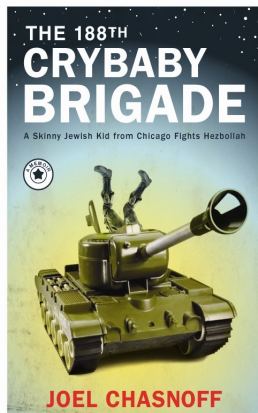

#### **4<sup>th</sup> REPORT ON RABBINIC SEARCH**

As part of its commitment to keep you informed regarding the ongoing rabbinic search process and our progress towards finding the “best possible” Rabbi to lead B’nai Sholom forward when Rabbi Wucher retires on June 30, 2011, the Rabbinic Search Committee issues this, its 4th Report. Our initial Report was included in the January Newsletter and included a detailed description of the search process we are using, and a number of relevant and frequently asked questions with our answers to them. It was followed by a 2<sup>nd</sup> Report in the February newsletter, and a 3<sup>rd</sup> Report in the March newsletter. All of these Reports are available from the Temple secretary if you did not see any of them.

The Rabbinic Search Committee is continuing to work diligently and to follow the search process that was previously adopted. As of March 31<sup>st</sup>, we have received resumés from eighteen interested candidates. We have carefully reviewed and considered their credentials and the background information each provided. We consulted with URJ and USCJ, and with our own Rabbi Wucher for his input. We have conducted limited background checks on fourteen of the candidates with whom we were favorably impressed, based solely on a review of their resumés. (three of the resumés were only recently received and we have not yet had an opportunity to follow up on them.) Based on all information available to date, the Search Committee has only formally rejected two candidates who, it was unanimously agreed, were clearly not a match for B’nai Sholom. We have conducted telephone/skype interviews with eight particularly promising candidates, and the remaining eight candidates are still under consideration, although the committee has put their resumés on hold.

Based on thorough discussion and careful review and recommendations of the Search Committee, the Selection Committee invited five candidates to come to Huntington to interview with the full Selection Committee and to meet the Congregation. The process of resumé review, background check, phone interview and personal interview has been repeated as we receive additional resumés.

All of the on-site interviews were completed by early April. The Selection Committee is scheduled to meet within the next two weeks to discuss the candidates interviewed in Huntington, and the input received from the Congregation, and to make some decisions concerning the Rabbi candidates.

Again, we encourage you to share with members of the Search Committee your thoughts about the search process, your vision for the future of B’nai Sholom, and other relevant topics; and to take full advantage of the opportunities that will be available to you to interact with candidates of interest. Please feel free to share your comments to any of the Search Committee members.
