FROM THE RABBI

You shall explain to your children on that day, 'It is because of what God did for ME when I went free from Egypt.'

Exodus 13:8

Torah is True. As it says in Mishkan Tefilah, our Shabbat prayer book, “What happened once upon a time happens all the time.” The Passover Seder is for getting together with family and friends and telling some of your stories and how they echo the Exodus stories. Mitzrayim – which is Hebrew for “Egypt” – is read also as *mi tzarim* – Hebrew for “from the narrow, difficult places.” So we tell stories: how our grandparents got out of Russia, or how our parents fought through poverty and illness, or how we struggled to get an education and find fulfilling work.

Passover is about getting out of slavery – in its many forms. And not just for me or my family or for us as Jews. Isaiah teaches us to be a light to the nations (42:6, 49:6, 60:3). Passover is about winning freedom of all sorts for everyone we can. Freedom from hunger, freedom from discrimination, freedom from addiction... The list is long.

The task seems impossible. As Rabbi Tarfon taught (Pirquei Avot 2:11), “The day is short, the work is much, the workers are lazy, the reward is great and the Master is pressing.”

Rabbi Tarfon also taught, “It is not up to you to complete the task...” Whew! We do not have to do it all! He continues, “...neither are you free to absolve yourself of it.” We have to do this people. So. We do it together.

During the Omer Period, the fifty days from Passover to Shavuot, anniversary of the giving of the Torah – we will again raise money for the Facing Hunger Food Bank. We have no monetary goal in mind this year – just that every household participate. Drop a check or some cash into the tzedakah box in the social hall, or send it into the office. That is just a little thing we do together to help feed hungry people in our area. (Make your check out to B’nai Sholom with “food bank” on the memo line.)

There is also that most daunting issue facing us: drug addiction, with all its ramifications. Our own Jessica Pressman has met with the Mayor and arranged a community forum on local drug enforcement and treatment efforts.

We changed our B’nai Sholom Board meeting so that all the board can attend the forum on Tuesday, April 7. The next meeting will be Tuesday, May 5, 6:15 p.m. at Cabell County Library, Meeting Room 1. See you there!

Live the truth of Torah this year. Tell your stories of exodus from narrow places. Help others to find their way out as well.

Wishing you a meaningful and fulfilling Passover and Omer Season.

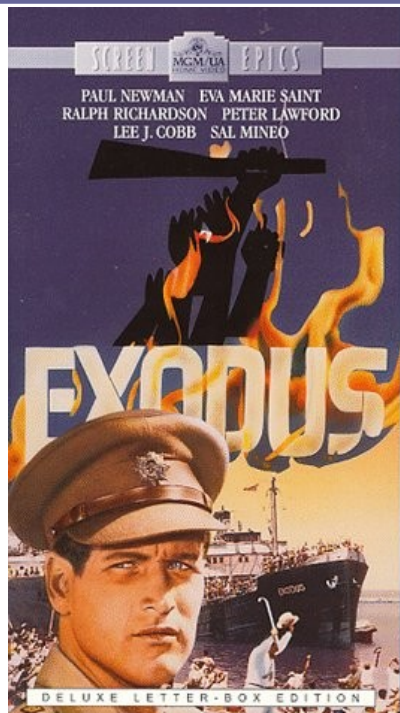

The *Empty Bowls* offers guests who contribute \$15, a generous portion of soup donated by area restaurants, and served in a unique ceramic bowl, handmade by a student in Marshall's Keramos Student Pottery Guild.

The bowl is yours to take home as a lasting reminder of the hunger that so many in our region regularly face.

There is also an opportunity to bid on dozens of items at a SILENT AUCTION.

Last year, the nearly 1,000 people in attendance at Empty Bowls had the opportunity to bid on dozens of items, including gift baskets from local businesses, Marshall University Season Football Tickets, Marshall Artist Series Season Tickets and 2 seats on the New River Train Foliage Excursion.

Last year's lunch and the auction raised nearly \$14,000, with all proceeds going to the Facing Hunger Food Bank (formerly Huntington Area Food Bank) – a nonprofit food distribution center that provides food to soup kitchens, emergency relief shelters and other hunger relief programs throughout the Tri-State.

Each dollar donated at Empty Bowls enables the Food Bank to distribute seven pounds of food to the hungry in our region. Every \$15 donation – the price of your special lunch – will feed an entire family for three weeks. **As partners in this important project, B'nai Sholom Congregation has assumed responsibility for obtaining items for the SILENT AUCTION.** This will involve contacting local businesses and local attractions for donations.
