FROM THE RABBI

TZEDAKAH - Tzedek, Tzedek tirdof – Justice, justice shall you pursue! Deuteronomy 16:20

Tzedakah, our obligation to give to people less well off than we are, stems from our concept of justice. We do not necessarily give out of the goodness of our hearts, or from love for our fellow humans. Rather, we give because it is the right thing to do. It is who we are. This concept of taking care of others is firmly rooted in Judaism. You may have heard me talk about the widely divergent interpretations given to a particular text in the Biblical times, by Talmudic Rabbis, by Medieval Sages and by modern scholars. In the case of tzedakah there is no difference of opinion about the fact that Jews help support each other – and the rest of the world as well. The complications arise when we realize our resources are limited and we have to decide *which* person or cause to support.

Rabbi Yosef taught If you have the choice to lend money to a Jew or a non-Jew, the Jew has preference; the poor or the rich, the poor takes precedence; your poor relative or another poor person in your town, your relative comes first; the poor of your city and the poor of another town, the poor of your own town have prior rights.

Babylonian Talmud, Bava Metzia, 71a

This seems straightforward enough, until you think of other situations. What about a local non-Jew versus a Jew from out of town? What about a relatively well-to-do family member versus a poor stranger? Being thoughtful about our giving is part of our tradition. The most important thing is to give.

There is a medieval text, the *Shulchan Arukh*, which tells us to prioritize our family when allocating tzedakah. The same text wonders

"That implies one need not give at all to those who fall outside of a particular group. But it is well known that every wealthy person has many more relatives who are poor, and how much more is that true for people whose tzedakah funds are scant! And if this is the case poor people without wealthy relatives will die of starvation. Therefore, every person, whether of modest or significant means, is obligated to give a portion of his or her tzedakah money to needy people who are not relatives."

A Tzedakah Box has recently appeared on the wall in B'nai Sholom's Social Hall. It is not there to ask for money for the congregation. It is there as an OPPORTUNITY every time you are here to contribute to the Rabbi's Discretionary Fund.

I use that money for local and remote Jews and non-Jews in need, recently Team for WV Children, Mazon, American Jewish World Service, and local individuals. From time to time we may decide to support a particular cause. In that case we will post a notice of the cause and all funds collected while that card is up will go to that recipient.

By the way, the first person to donate to the B'nai Sholom Tzedakah Box was NOAH COMPTON! Thank you, Noah, you are a real mensch.

Wishing you the joy of regularly contributing to help those in need!



Thanks To All Who Have Supported B'nai B'rith Huntington Lodge #795 Through the Years

Huntington Lodge #795 of B'nai B'rith has been in service for nearly a century, having been chartered in 1916. During that time, the Lodge has been active socially as well as having compiled a long, proud, enviable history of service to our local and broader communities. Over the years, the accomplishments of Lodge 795 must be credited to the commitment of its members, especially that ever-present core group of loyal Ben B'riths who have always been active, and could be relied upon to make things happen.

Unfortunately, in recent years as our numbers have declined due to death and relocations, we have also found that demands on peoples' time have changed and expanded, and priorities have, in many cases, shifted. As a result of these factors, our membership roster has shrunk, and the interest and commitment of many of our remaining members has flagged. The Board of Trustees of Lodge 795, after long and difficult deliberation, has therefore determined that there is no longer sufficient interest to attempt to maintain an active Lodge. As a result, the Board is announcing that, effective immediately, we are regrettably deactivating the Lodge and disbanding. If you are currently a member of B'nai B'rith International, that will not change.

If you wish to be affiliated with an active lodge, you may contact B'nai B'rith International, 2020 K Street, NW, 7th Floor, Washington, DC 20006 to determine what options may be open to you to in that regard. We encourage everyone to continue to support the worthy efforts of B'nai B'rith International.

We offer our sincere thanks to our members who have been loyal over the years, and to our Jewish and general communities who have enthusiastically supported the worthy efforts in which we have been engaged. Conduct of our two primary activities in recent years, i.e., the reading of the names in annual observance of Yom Hashoah and the distribution of food baskets at Thanksgiving, has been assumed by B'nai Sholom Congregation, and we look forward to and will strongly support their annual continuation.

We regret having to make this very difficult decision; however, we believe it is the only logical and practical course of action in our current circumstances.
