FROM THE RABBI

DEDICATION AND INCLUSION – and LEARNING

Laurel was touched by her standing ovation And the congregants' praise in profusion. Marcia was awed by members' dedication And her feelings of total inclusion.

This was one of several quatrains in the rhyming thank you we received from Laurel Federbush – our October Harpist in Residence – and her mother, Marcia. How appropriate! Dedication is our ongoing theme of the year as we figure out what it is about B'nai Sholom that is worth rededicating ourselves to. We are the bastion of Judaism in a very broad area – for 50 miles to the east, 150 to the west, and more in any other direction. That is only a reason to persevere if there is something of value here.

Laurel's mother hit upon one strength of ours: Inclusion. We excel at welcoming guests. Not only do we have an accessibility ramp up to the bima, we have an accessible restroom. In keeping with the Reform Movement's recent resolution in support of transgender individuals, it doubles as a gender-neutral restroom.

Why do we care? The principal is called in Hebrew *Betzelem Elohim*, in God's image. Bereishit (Genesis) 1:27 — "In the image of God, betzelem Elohim, God created [humanity]." As each individual is a reflection of God, each person deserves honor, *kavod* in Hebrew. Rabbi Yochanan ben Zakai was the leading sage in the Land of Israel at the end of the Second Temple period. Talmud tells us that he had a way to practice kavod every day: He took it upon himself to be the first to greet each person he met, whether or not they were strangers. You may say it's not safe to greet random people on the street. But Rabbi Yochanan lived in the END of the Second Temple Period — a time of great social unrest, to say the least. We can still let our sense of self-preservation guide us. However, the more common reasons we don't greet strangers are because we're too busy or self-absorbed, or it's just "not done." Try greeting everyone for a day. Let me know how it goes.

B'nai Sholom is the center of Jewish learning for this area. Judaism is a treasure trove of wisdom to help guide us in our everyday lives. I am looking for a group of people to study "Season of Mussar" with me this spring. Mussar is a practice of consciously living our values. The charge, which covers the materials we'll receive from the Mussar Institute is \$100. I would be glad to provide a scholarship for anyone who needs it. What's more, I will donate \$100 to B'nai Sholom for each person who signs up, so it won't be a drag on our fiscal situation. This is an investment in the value of Jewish learning. "Season of Mussar" is a more in-depth and engaged version of the Mussar study several of us have been doing for a year or so. January 17 will be our last one of those sessions for awhile. Come see what you think, or contact me so I can answer your questions about it.

Finding the value in Jewish learning will help us dedicate ourselves to its continuance.
