FROM THE RABBI

Sometimes my husband, Steven, and I watch Steven Colbert on TV (the 7:30 rerun, not the late night show). Once Steven remarked during the cheering and chanting "Steven, Steven..." at the opening of the show, "Wouldn't it be nice to start your work day with a crowd cheering for you?"

Last month in my capacity as Outreach Educator at Hebrew Union College I went to a Cincinnati Catholic high school to speak with 80 ninth grade boys. Their teacher introduced me and they cheered. "Wow," I said. "And I haven't even said anything yet." Then I got an idea. "Hey, could we get a chant going? Rabbi Jean, Rabbi Jean..." I began. They obligingly took it up and chanted my name a few times. Very polite.

We turned our attention to the topic at hand, which was Israel. More about that another time. Part-way through the session we paused for an announcement over the PA system. The results of a contest were announced, and the boys just exploded. They leaped from their seats and a roar shook the walls with high-fives all around. They settled down easily and we continued our conversation. Just before I left I thanked them for their attention and engagement. Then I said, "Remember when the announcement came on and you leapt out of your seats and raised the rafters with your cheering? Would you do that for me?" And they did! And broke into a full-throated Rabbi Jean chant.

Several of you have asked me if there is anything you can do to help me get settled this summer. Let me set your mind at ease – I am not expecting daily gatherings of cheering to get started, though I do expect we will find ways to acknowledge each other's work. Rabbi Wucher is helping me to get acclimated, giving me the benefit of his expertise and many years of relationship with you. The Transition Team is helping to frame the process and ease the inevitable bumps in the road. Honestly, the best thing you can do for me – and for the congregation – is to spend a little time with me.

There will be several get-togethers over the summer, which will be announced through email. Take advantage of those. Introduce yourself – and please be patient as I learn to match names to faces.

Even better, let's arrange to have a walk together, just the two of us. One of my favorite things is to be outside moving. Or we can sit and talk. Sometimes relaxing is the name of the game. I plan to be in contact with everyone I can over the next few months, but it would wonderful if I did not have to make the first move. If my inbox is swamped with requests for meetings and all I have to do is fit you into my day, I will be thrilled!

The topic of our conversations can be anything you want. These are the sorts of things I'm hoping to find out: What inspires you; What keeps you up at night; What you devote your days to; The causes dear to you; How you think about God; Your aspirations for yourself, your family, B'nai Sholom, the Jewish people, and humanity; The various changes we're all going through. With every change comes loss. I know Rabbi Wucher holds a fond place in your lives and he will be missed. Yet, we are blessed to have him continuing on as Rabbi Emeritus.

From the liturgy for the summer we have the grief-stricken cry from Lamentations*: "Eichah! Alas! Lonely sits the city . . . Bitterly she weeps in the night. . . there is none to comfort her." In every Torah service all through the year we recite the hopeful conclusion of the book of Lamentations: "Return us to you God and we will return. Renew our days as of old." I am truly honored to have this opportunity to continue with you the renewal of the Jewish people at Congregation B'nai Sholom.

Tisha B'Av - the commemoration for the destruction of both the First and the Second Temple as well as the Expulsion of the Jews from Spain in 1492 and many other calamities of the Jewish people - is a 24-hour fast day which begins at sunset of August 8 this year.
