### FROM THE RABBI

"A PALACE IN TIME MADE OF SOUL, JOY AND RETICENCE" Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel

Hey everybody, make Shabbat special and spend part of it here at B'nai Sholom sometimes.

Shabbat is such a gift, I don't understand why more Jews don't embrace it wholeheartedly. Just think, one day EVERY WEEK when you can say (for example): no laundry, no answering phone calls, no chores – whatever that means. It is such a relief to take the opportunity to slow down and appreciate what is most important in life: Family, friends, being alive. This week try saying, "Not today, it's Shabbat!"



Shabbat is one of the great innovations we have offered the world. The concept of one day a week to rest from work was unheard of in ancient times. It became a cornerstone of Israelite religion and then of Judaism. The Rabbis of Talmudic times who wrote the Shabbat Kiddush, the prayer we sing before drinking the Shabbat wine, told us in that prayer what Shabbat is about. It is a memorial of creation; appreciate life! It is a remembrance of the Exodus from Egypt; live as equals on this day and explore what freedom means!

Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel described Shabbat as a Palace in Time. There is not any particularly holy PLACE in the world, rather TIME is what we sanctify. A specific time, Shabbat, comes every week as an invitation to try again to live a perfect day. Rabbi Heschel says Shabbat is made of soul. What that means to 21st century Huntingtonian Jews is an open question. What feeds your soul? Music, exercise, meditation, feasting with family, walking in the woods, studying with friends, prayer? It may not be the same thing as what brings you joy. For example, my soul was fed recently by reading an account of a psychologist's desperately deep depression: Undercurrents - A Life Beneath the Surface, by Martha Manning. It enlarged my soul and made me a more whole person, but I sobbed through it. I didn't read it on Shabbat. For me Shabbat is for music and poetry, Torah and prayer, special food and family.


I do not expect everyone to find that special joyous soul food in services at B'nai Sholom, though I do hope you try each of our Shabbat services to see what they have to offer. I want you to explore wide ranges of possibilities, AND I want you to keep in mind that one of our greatest strengths as Jews is learning from each other. Rabbi Hillel (1st century sage) said, "Do not separate yourself from the community." We all need time to ourselves. We also need the sustenance and richness that comes from socializing, working, playing, studying and praying together, so...

### FROM THE PRESIDENT

### Dear Congregants,

As the new president of B'nai Sholom, I would first like to thank out going president Mark Newfeld for being a very strong and effective leader . Under Mark's guidance, B'nai Sholom thrived and evolved. The good news is, as past president Mark will continue to serve on the Board for another two year term. Also, it is important to thank board members Malinda Cains and Lisa Ketchum for their dedicated service on the board. Both were very responsible and committed board members, always there to lend a strong helping hand. Their presence will be missed. Fortunately, with Rabbi Jean as our spiritual leader and the experience of our board, I have no doubt we are well positioned to meet these challenges. My idea to establish a Past President's Club, which includes 14 past presidents, will get the ball rolling by creating for us a much needed 5,10,15 year long term plan. I am anxious to see what these great minds together can foresee for the future of our congregation. The first meeting is scheduled for late August, with past president Sharon Pressman leading the charge.
- ❖ Be innovative and experiment with a variety of new ideas, programs and events in hopes of engaging all those who seek a meaningful Jewish life. Also, it is important to develop the next generation of leaders by inspiring young members of our congregation to get involved and learn the ropes. This way, when the time comes they will have the knowledge and understanding needed to lead and preserve the future of our congregation.

Again, thank you for this honor. I promise the board and I will do everything in our power to keep the congregation moving forward.





### Trips to Israel and Jewish Camp Grants

The Federated Jewish Charities of Huntington provides grants for following programs:

"Trip to Israel" program will provide grants of up to \$8,000 per person for Huntington Jewish youth ages high school to 28 years on approved trips to Israel. Children and grandchildren of Temple members who live outside of Huntington and Marshall Jewish Students are eligible. Six grants are available in 2013 and 2014

"Jewish Camp" program will provide grants of up to \$4,000 per student for B'nai Sholom Religious School students to attend Jewish Camp. Ten grants are available for 2013 and 2014. "Taglit Birthright" offers free trips to Israel for Jews 18 to 26 years. We can assist you with the

application and being given priority preference to be accepted for this program. September begins the registration for Winter 2013 Trips. www.birthrightisrael.com

"Adult Trips to Israel" program will provide grants up to \$1,500 (Temple members) and \$1,000 (non Temple Members) for the Huntington Jewish community to travel to Israel on approved trips. Ten grants are available in 2013 and 2014.

Grants are given based meeting qualifications, completing the application on time, availability of funds and not financial need.
