From the Rabbi

PEACE CORPS VOLUNTEERS

My mother was a Peace Corps Volunteer. You can be one too. Not by joining the international Peace Corps based in DC, but by joining the Volunteer Corps of the Children of Peace, the Volunteers of B'nai Sholom. Back in the day, there was a convention to precede the name of a Jewish congregation with two *Quf*'s. *Quf* is a Hebrew letter which sounds like "k". This abbreviation stood for *Kehilah Kedoshah*, or "Holy Community." Now our official name is "Congregation B'nai Sholom." B'nai Sholom, of course, "means Children of Peace." What happened to the "Holy" part?

There is a Dan Nichols song that anyone who's been to a Reform summer camp lately has heard called *Kehilah Kedoshah*. The song envisions the holy community as extending back to Mt. Sinai and including every Jew since. Dan expects that keeping that idea in mind will inspire Jews to "play a part... seek the truth... remember the pain... find the joy... do the work." Each holy congregation is a microcosm in that grand holy community of Israel.

Remember the lesson of Korach, which we studied a couple of weeks ago. Korach told Moses – "What makes you think **you** are so special? We are **all** holy." Korach got swallowed up by the earth for presuming to be holy when he was only motivated by his own aggrandizement. The lesson was that God had indeed told the Israelites, "You will be holy." The point in using the future tense is that it takes work to be holy. We are not holy just on account of being Jews. We have to walk the walk. AND it is not enough to do it as an individual off on my own somewhere. We have to do it together.

There is no point in reinstating the use of the term *Kehilah Kedoshah*; it is quite presumptuous. However, as something to aim toward, Holiness is right on. Talmud teaches that every Jew – good or not (however you want to define that) – has a part to play in the congregation. More than that. Talmud teaches that just as the incense included bad smelling ingredients as well as the sweet frankincense and myrrh, all Jews are **necessary** in order for us to be holy.

So join B'nai Sholom's Peace Corps Volunteers* and help us aim in the direction of holiness. Even if it's just to offer your two cents on a particular issue that concerns you. We'll even feed you for your trouble. Sunday, July 12, at 10:00, right after our Weekday Minyan, pick up some food and take your pick of six different working groups to participate in. The schedule is outlined on page 5. If you can't make it that day, just let me know your passion and we'll see where we can fit it in.

It won't be easy. Quf"Quf also stands for *ktzat kasheh*, which means a little bit difficult. But with all of us working together, only *ktzat* – only *a little!*




THE DAYS OF AWE ARE APPROACHING Come Study with us: The Rosh Hashanah Morning Service



Tisha B'Av is a fast day commemorating the destruction of both Temples.


This year the fast runs from sundown July 25 to sundown July 26.

It is a complete fast from food and water for 24 hours, much like Yom Kippur.

What is the difference? On Yom Kippur we don't need to eat because we are focused on the prayers, music, and study that are helping us to clear out our souls for the coming year.

On Tisha B'Av we can't bear to eat because we are focused on the immense suffering of the calamities of Jewish history.

During the service we will read from the Book of Lamentations (*Eicha* in Hebrew).


