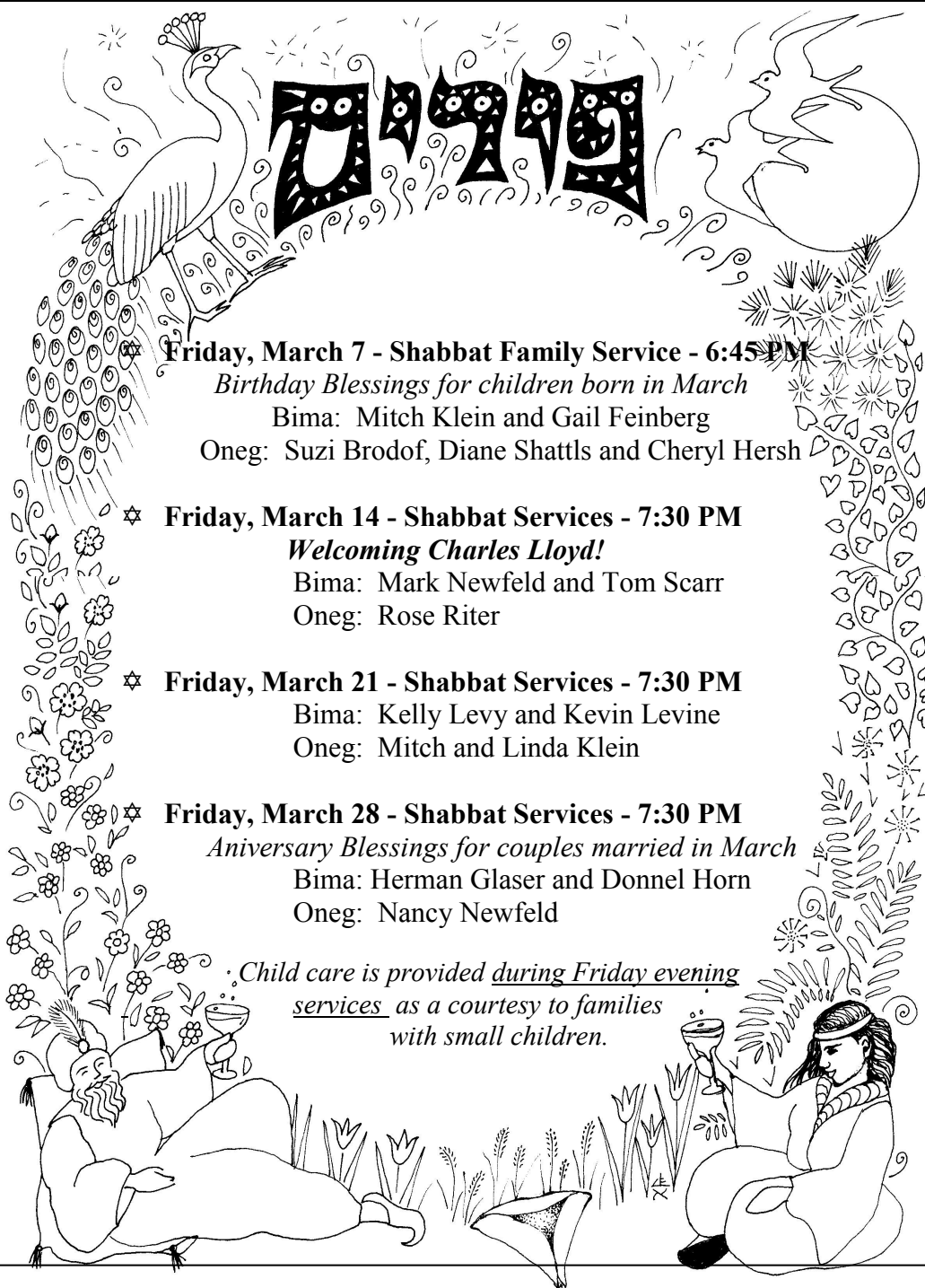

## FROM THE RABBI

*Wrestling with God and Men – homosexuality in the Jewish tradition* (a book by Rabbi Steven Greenberg)

Last summer I agreed to teach about Judaism's guidance regarding social action in general, and with reference to our obligations regarding a bill in the West Virginia House of Delegates called Employment and Housing Non-Discrimination Act (EHNDA), in particular, which would prohibit discrimination on the bases of sexual orientation. There are at least four major topics in this question:

- Positions in Judaism on social action
- Positions in Judaism on homosexuality
- Fear of taking an unpopular stand when one is a religious minority
- What our sources of authority really are

This month let's look at the second one. I just read the above-mentioned book by Orthodox Rabbi, Steven Greenberg. Many years after being ordained and trying to fit into the Orthodox ideal of marriage to a woman, he realized he was gay. Rabbi Greenberg is devoted to Torah as God's word and to *halakhah*, the system of considering all questions from Jewish textual tradition. The Orthodox version of this system in recent years has resisted change, mostly in response to Reform Judaism's surge of changes. Here is a really quick review of a few of the points of the book.

There is indeed a verse in Leviticus (18:22) which seems to preclude male homosexuality. Literally it is something like: "And with a male you shall not lie the lyings of a woman; it is abhorrent." An action is prohibited, not emotional or physical desire. Torah also does not prohibit lesbian relationships, though the rabbis who came later do. By investigating the Hebrew and how similar phrases work in other parts of Torah, the rabbi comes up with the understanding that what is abhorrent to God is when people use ANY sexual behavior in a violent and abusive manner.

This is not normative Orthodox Jewish thought on the matter. Orthodox rabbis range from strongly emotional anti-homosexual statements, to accepting of gay couples in their community. In between there are rabbis who take a "hate the sin, love the sinner" approach. The Reconstructionist Movement was the first to ordain rabbis without regard to their sexual orientation in 1984. The Reform Movement followed in the 90's, Jewish Renewal in 2006, and the Conservative Movement just a few years ago.

Another point to take into consideration in any question, is the tension between the stabilizing forces of tradition and the evolution needed to grow towards greater justice and truth. No one person can decide anything for all of Judaism. In fact, no group can, as we do not allow a ruling hierarchy in Judaism at present. On the other hand each person must decide for him or herself where the best path lies. A congregation – even one with a varied heritage like B'nai Sholom – can indeed, if it so chooses, decide to become a force for change in the world. We have some way to go before that. Next month, the month of Passover, perhaps we can consider the Jewish imperative toward social change and what that entails.

Wishing you a funny, irreverent, Purim – full of standing expectations on their head!

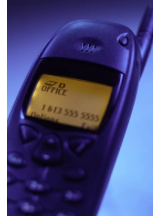

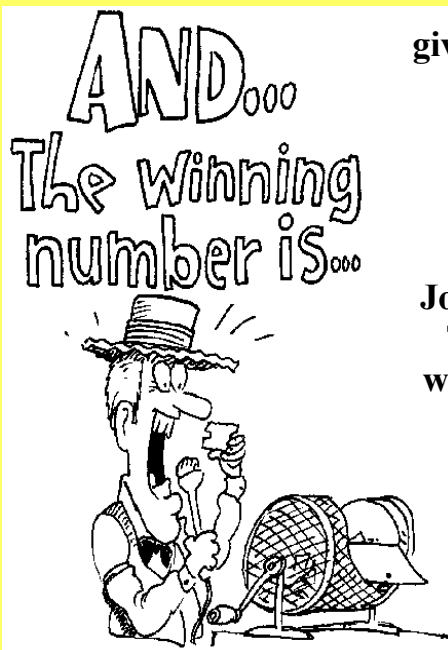

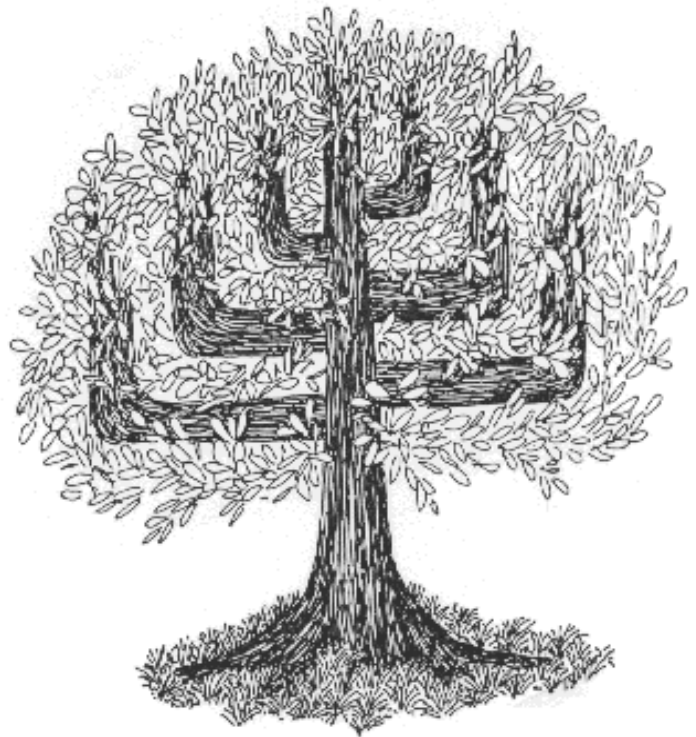

# Simchas & Tchotchkes

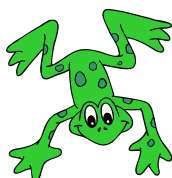
It's still a tad early to begin your spring cleaning, but ladies and gentlemen, we all know there's never enough time when it comes to preparing for Passover.
