FROM THE RABBI

Living Torah

"God obligates us all to be holy not in some general abstractly spiritual way but in the humdrum particularities of making and spending money..."

Dr. Eugene Borowitz

Do you ever feel so swamped by demands on your money and your time that you just throw up your hands? Overwhelming need can be paralyzing. One way to counter that effect is to just do a little bit, do *some*thing. To all of you who are donating to the Huntington Food Bank Barrel when you come to temple: Thank you! It is a drop in the bucket (literally) – no more and no less.

hrwt Torah - Teaching

At our last *Brunch with the Rabbi* we considered various ideas about Torah. One such ancient idea is that we are each called to bring Torah into our lives, that each one of our lives is, in fact, a living torah. So how do we live Torah? On the one hand however you choose to live is your torah – your expression of what is important. On the other hand, as each one learns from every other one – and we all learn from Torah – I continually adjust my living as I try to bring more Torah (teachings from Jewish texts) into my own torah (the teaching that is my life).

hqdc Tzedakah - Charity?

Tzedakah is often translated as "charity," but the words contain different teachings – different torahs, if you will. The word "charity" comes from a Latin root for love. The idea is to give to the poor out of love. The root of "tzedakah" is "tzedek" – as in "Tzedek, tzedek tirdof – Justice, justice shall you pursue (Deuteronomy 16:20)." The torah of this word is that giving some of what I have to others is an obligation, whether I feel kindly toward them or not. Our textual tradition has explored this concept in depth considering the different levels of tzedakah, the limits of tzedakah, and how to set priorities.

Being Jewish is all about knowing I can never make everything right, I can never do anything perfectly, but I keep trying to head in the right direction anyway. Please join us on November 19 for Shabbat morning service, including Torah study. Directly after service we plan to brunch and study some more Torah (and each other's torahs) and come up with some strategies for hqdc tzedakah. With any luck we will gain some insights into Living Torah.

May this Hebrew month of Cheshvan (no Jewish holy days other than Shabbat) be one of Thanksgiving!
