Here in Huntington it is easy to forget our attachments to the broader Jewish world. This month we have two ways to renew some of those bonds. Of course you've heard that a group of us is traveling to Israel after Thanksgiving – more about that upon our return.

More immediately, we are participating in a GLOBAL DAY OF JEWISH LEARNING on Sunday, November 18. Jewish communities around the world will be studying the same texts together with video lessons from Rabbi Adin Steinsaltz, one of the great scholars of our time. As the Global Day website puts it:

*Rabbi Adin Steinsaltz is a world-renowned teacher, philosopher, social critic and prolific author, who has been one of our people's greatest champions for open access to Jewish learning. His life's mission has been to give Jewish texts and learning back to the Jewish people.*

The theme of the day is **Blessing**. Not only are we going to study blessing, we are going to spread our blessings around with our annual Thanksgiving project. Here's the schedule for the morning:

9:00 am, **Weekday Prayer Service for Everyone**, Chapel

10:00 am, **Everyone Fill Thanksgiving Baskets**, Social Hall and Conference Room

11:30 am, **Adult Learning**, Conference Room, Video from Rabbi Adin Steinsaltz in Israel, Local learning facilitated by Rabbi Jean, Conference Room. Two consecutive sessions:

- Blessing Over the Bad: How Do We Relate to Bad Things?
- Is There a Recipe for Prayer? A Lesson in Picking the Perfect Words

(Small children are always welcome to color or play among us while we study)

11:00 am, **Religious School**; Snack, fun projects and learning about blessings through the book *Terrible, Terrible*; facilitated by our **Confirmation Class**.

One of the challenges of living in a Jewish community rather secluded from the rest of the Jewish world is to continue to be a part of Klal Yisrael – the worldwide People of Israel. Services and holy day observances unite us with Jews around the world. On November 18, we will be studying the same texts as 300 other Jewish communities in 40 countries. Not only that, but we will be getting to know each other on a deeper level, as we do every time we study Torah together. Hope to see you there!
