

FROM THE RABBI

TORAH LIVES ON... in Huntington!

Why is the Torah compared to a fig tree? Because most trees - olive, grape, date - have their fruit harvested all at one time, but the fig's fruit is picked gradually. So it is with the Torah: You learn a little today and more tomorrow, for you cannot learn it in one or two years. Midrash Bemidbar Rabbah 12:9 (5th century in the Land of Israel)

This summer both Herb and Pauline brought me figs from their fig trees. Eating those figs was as pleasurable as learning the Torah of basic Judaism with thirty of my newest friends. In ten weeks we skimmed over the life cycles, the annual cycle of holy days, and Jewish history – among other things.

This fall we continue leafing out that tree by approaching two foundational texts of Judaism: The Tanakh (Hebrew Bible) and the Siddur (Prayer Book). Tuesday nights at 7:30 our Adult B'nei Mitzvah class is studying the Siddur and one Torah portion. At the end of the year many members of the group will lead a service and read from Torah. That part is optional, so if you just want to come to learn without standing in front of the congregation you are most welcome!

Wednesday nights at 7:30 we are studying parts of Tanakh, Hebrew Bible, reading in English. We begin with Ecclesiastes. We first approach the text by trying to understand the biblical world view as near as we can figure it out. Then we add a few of the myriad commentaries contributed by Jews in various times and places. The commentaries tell us more about the people who wrote them than the original text. The important thing is that these layers of meaning have been added to the stories from the Tanakh through the ages, enriching them and expanding them. The next step is to understand what our own generation needs to draw from this ancient text. Torah is a Tree of Life! This entire process makes that a reality, and Torah lives on as we keep on learning.

Our **Eat, Pray, Learn** brunches on Saturday will be all about Israel this fall. Whether or not you are coming on our trip to Israel in November I entreat you, I implore you, to come to as many of these as you can. Remember this part from my sermon about blessings and curses on Rosh Hashanah:

Here is the curse in the love we have for Israel – it has been fracturing Jewish community when we should be working together to help Israel. The only way forward is to have conversations – some of which will be awkward . . . We need all viewpoints represented as we try to figure out how we can work together to carry out this important task. *Kol Yisrael arevim zeh lazeh*. All Israel is responsible for one another.

This too is Torah, My plan is to provide an overview of the history and culture of Israel, including the points of view of various groups who have an interest in Israel. Esther Elitzur will help us with some modern conversational Hebrew and tell us some of her story on October 27.

Of course, we always study Torah during our Saturday morning services, so come try that out as well. Our year is off to a propitious beginning. I invite you to take advantage of one of our many opportunities to learn together. This is the richness of Judaism, and Torah lives on.

The money is going to help uninsured and underinsured women to receive mammograms at the St Mary's Breast Center.




While less known than Halloween, these holidays are dear to our hearts and the shop carries many items to help you celebrate in joyous ways.


