FROM THE RABBI

Jewels for the Finding

"I get very angry with people who make everything revolve around them as though they are so superior. But then my study partner said that in her experience people often act that way when they are insecure. That makes so much sense – and that will make it a lot easier for me to deal with them in the future."

This jewel of wisdom, was gleaned from our first Shabbat learning brunch. Some came from the morning service (where we were singing and studying the Torah reading) and some came from our other Saturday morning activities. We passed dishes – on that particular morning of pita, hummus, eggplant salad, tabouleh – and caught up with each other's lives. Thus revived, we read an English translation of a 2500 year old text about God. We learned a bit about the rabbinic interpretation of it and how it came to be included in the High Holy Day Prayer Book, the machzor, which we will read on Rosh Hashannah and Yom Kippur. In groups of twos and threes we considered the musings of a modern rabbi connecting those so-called Thirteen Attributes of God to a medieval Jewish practice of self-improvement called Mussar. We looked at it all through the lens of our own experience and this is what happened: At least one of us took away a personally useful lesson in forgiveness.

This is my idea of heaven. The only thing that would make it better is if we could do it outside. Something to look forward to on Sukkot.

Each month a Shabbat learning brunch is planned. I hope you can come to them all. I cannot stress enough how much we need feedback on this. If you love it, that's great. If you don't come it would help us to know why not – bad time for you, not interested in the topic, don't want to come to temple on Saturday morning... These are all perfectly valid reasons and we want to offer something that will fit your needs and preferences. What makes life sing for you? Let us know!

All the texts I bring can be studied quite productively in English. Hebrew, however, adds a deeper dimension, so we have organized two Hebrew classes. They will be on Thursday evenings beginning October 13, the first Thursday after Yom Kippur.

6:00-7:00 pm – Hebrew Alef – a beginning class for all who want to learn or review the letters.

7:00-8:00 pm – Hebrew Bet – an intermediate class for those who know the letters and want to work on acquiring more vocabulary and grammar.

Our goal is not simply to learn a bit more about our texts – though that is in itself a worthy one. Our goal is transformative learning – that we apply the jewels of our discussions to our lives. The key to a vibrant Judaism is that Jews find expression of our deepest joys and fears, and suggestions for how to live our lives the best we can. The key to that is Talmud Torah – study. Join us. Shanah tovah umetukah – May you have a good and a sweet year, full of learning!

It's a great time to take a drive and take in the beauty of the season! Why not pack a picnic lunch? Take your time, relax!


