FROM THE RABBI

The Torah is older than the world. It consisted of fire, being written in black letters of flame upon a white ground of fire. God held counsel with it at the creation of the world, since it was wisdom itself. It was given in the language of all peoples; for the voice of the Divine Revelation was seventyfold. Every letter of Torah is a living creature.
(from the Jewish Encyclopedia, citing a number of Jewish texts)

The letters in the Torah are Hebrew letters. There was a time when I only knew a few of them. Because I knew that *lamed* was the only Hebrew letter with an ascender (a part of the letter that stuck up above the rest of the letters) I could follow along in my prayer book during the Torah readings of the High Holy Days. Every time the rabbi read an “L” sound I bounced to the next *lamed* sticking up high. (*Lamed* is the letter that sticks up in the word shalom, which is pictured here.) It may not have been a particularly intellectual way to participate, but it allowed me to follow along in the Hebrew to a degree. To be a Jew is to learn all your life. We each start where we can.

We all have a FABULOUS opportunity this month to learn from the *sofer*, the Torah Scribe, who is coming to work on our scrolls. He will teach us how best to care for them. It takes a whole cadre of people to do it – we have eight *Sifrei Torah*, eight scrolls! – and I hope many people will be moved to come see what we can learn from Rabbi Salazer. He will even teach us how we can do some of the cleaning so that when he returns to make the necessary repairs in the spring he will have less to do and the congregation will save money. Wednesday night, October 9, 6:30. I, for one, will be camped out most of the following day to watch him work and see what I can glean from him as he assesses our scrolls. Come join me! Thanks are due to Malinda Cains for making all the arrangements and to Herb and Betty Colker for funding.

Since arriving in Huntington, I’ve tried to offer plenty of adult learning opportunities. Every week we read aloud from Torah on Friday night. I translate as I go, and people who come regularly are learning some Hebrew words that way. I’m hopeful that the *divrei Torah*, the words of Torah or the sermons I prepare are useful as well – more educational than preachy. Every Saturday we have adult Torah Study before the religious school children arrive. Once a month this year we’ll have a Sunday Eat Pray Learn after the weekday minyan. We’ll have brunch and hear from a speaker, or have a discussion over a book or a movie. Wednesday evenings we study Hebrew at 6:30 and assorted topics at 7:30.

One congregant and I are reading the Book of Ecclesiastes together – in Hebrew with an English commentary, for an hour each week. If you ever want to sit down and ask me some questions, we can look up the answers together. If our learning opportunities don’t work for you and you’d like to broach a different subject or come at a different time, I would love to hear from you.

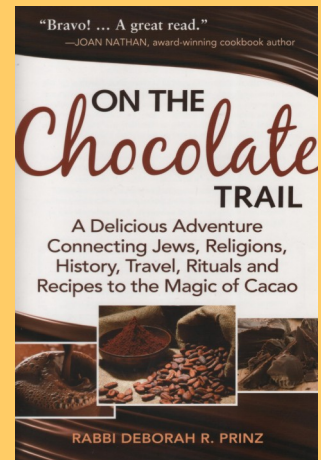

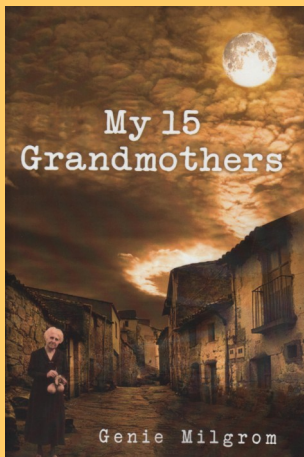
BOOK REVIEW- "MY 15 GRANDMOTHERS"

From the President

(Following is the speech delivered by Board President Diane Shattls' at the Rosh Hashanah Service)

Recently, I read 2 books that captured my attention. They were not about politics, current affairs or even famous people. Instead they were about relationships. Did you know that developing and strengthening relationships is the most important thing one can do in life? Develop meaningful relationships, they said, and your life will go from ordinary to extraordinary!



Fortunately, relationships are what the High Holidays are about! Each and every year they come to remind us that we should work hard to initiate, sustain and nurture relationships. That includes your relationship with yourself, family, friends, fellow congregants, community and G-d. Even our leadership at B'nai Sholom is devoted and focused on cultivating congregant and community relationships. The more we turn to each other for support and friendship, the more connected we will feel. People want to feel a sense of purpose and belonging, but that is only going to happen if you are not sitting on the sidelines. To get results you have to join in and participate.

So, how do you take that first step to feeling that connection with your B'nai Sholom family? For me, that connection started 32 years ago with B'nai B'rith bowling on Sunday mornings, cooking sessions in the kitchen and several years as Youth Group advisor. Had I not jumped in with both feet I know I would not be standing here today giving this speech as President.

We offer many worthwhile ways for you join in and come often. They include, meaningful worship services, life long learning, energetic social gatherings, facility improvement projects, a sensational Sisterhood, travel opportunities and tikkun olam - healing of the world.

For example, a meaningful worship service for me is Sunday morning minyan. I never miss coming unless I am out of town. It is the perfect beginning to every week. I look forward to seeing all the regulars and helping to make a minyan. When all of us are available, that easily adds up to over 20 people. There is even an opportunity to have breakfast or go for a run afterwards! This is where I get my sense of belonging!

Life long learning was demonstrated two weeks ago when five of our congregants shared a B'nai Mitzvah. Talk about hard work and dedication. It was a proud moment for them and us as we watched. This is where I get my sense of community!

Social gatherings this month were numerous. Two favorites of mine were the picnic and the door refurbishing project. Both received a lot of support and fun was had by all. In the past, we hired someone to do the doors, but this year with the energy of so many, both young and old, we, the congregants, took on the project, and I can proudly say the doors look amazing. Someone even called the office wanting to know who we were so they could hire us! This is where I get my sense of purpose!

So what might your first step towards building a meaningful relationship look like? Perhaps, you will invite a fellow congregant or student to join you for a Shabbat or holiday dinner;
OR, you will decide to attend a funeral for a family you don't know so the family and Rabbi won't be the only ones at the cemetery and a minyan can be made;
OR, you will approach a person sitting at services by themselves to come sit with you;
OR, you will encourage someone who hasn't been in the building lately to accompany you to one of the many activities offered....THE LIST OF IDEAS IS ENDLESS!

Remember, the shofar is sounded to wake us up, reminding us it's never too late to embrace what is most important in life. As we prepare now to hear the call of the shofar by Mark Newfeld I invite you to open your heart to what could be and take that first step by making the time to find out what makes your fellow congregants tick. I guarantee you won't regret it.

And to that I will say Amen and L'Shannah Tova!

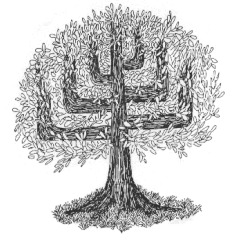

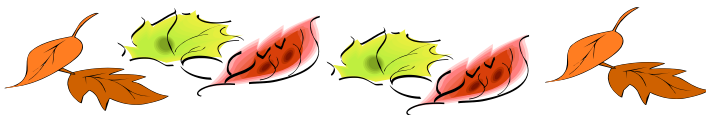
