FROM THE RABBI

HAKARAT HATOV - RECOGNIZING THE GOOD - GRATITUDE

"We are so used to our gifts that we don't even really see them anymore. We have grown so accustomed to them that they appear to us as typical, permanent, unremarkable features of our lives."

Bachya ibn Pakuda, 11th century Sage, as quoted by Alan Morinis in Everyday Holiness

There are two things I've seen mentioned over and over again in psychological literature as actually helpful to people feeling overwhelmed by life:

- Writing down your worries
- Writing down your blessings.

Apparently, the act of slowing the racing of our minds enough to write these things down is enough to reassure us that our worries are not actually overwhelming. All the things we have to be grateful for support us through the worries.

In Musar thought (Musar is a Jewish discipline of considering various character traits and becoming more skillful at living a good life) gratitude is called *Hakarat Hatov*, or recognition of the good. Hove what Bachya ibn Pakuda wrote a thousand years ago — that there are things we think are permanent and so we forget to be thankful for them. What do you assume you'll have when you wake up each morning? Health, living pain free, family members, home, job, reliable healthy food supply, clean air, clean water, living in the United States... the list goes on and on.

Sometimes I let my worries intrude more than is useful. Before our Shabbat Morning at Harveytown Park I thought, "Hardly anyone will come." Then, trying to think positive, "If a minyan shows up that will be enough." Well, you know what? About 25 people showed up, and a good time was had by all! We also had reason to be thankful for wool tallises on a cool morning. So thank you to everyone who came that day. The Beverages brought the Ark; Kelly brought food; Walt cooked the hot dogs; Pat brought eggs so I didn't have to eat hot dogs; Sam and James brought a couple of chairs for those not comfortable on picnic benches; plus many more contributions to the morning. You boosted my confidence in our congregation's willingness to do something a bit different and my role in it.

This week I've been writing notes to people to thank them for random acts of kindness. You'll find many thank yous in this newsletter as well. Diane, our President from Heaven, does such a good job at that. I invite you to try it yourself. The idea is not to just do it once and forget it, but to cultivate a practice of a platitude and its expression.

It looks like we will be forming a small group of a dozen or so people to study Musar Practice. I hope you will consider joining us as we teach each other skillful living. At each meeting we will study a different trait, a different *midah*: Simplicity, Humility, Order, Equanimity, Truth, etc. The plan is to study Jewish texts and then see how these things play out in our everyday lives.

May we all enjoy a year of learning together! Rabbi Jean E. Eglinton



Thank you to Marla and Lee Balaklaw for offering their expertise to save B'nai Sholom many dollars on our monthly cell phone, phone and internet bills at no cost to us.

Marla and Lee started a new franchise business - Schooley Mitchell. The purpose of their business is to reduce monthly costs for credit card processing, cell phone, internet, and landline phone services for businesses or organizations. They typically find savings of 25 to 30%. There is no cost for the initial analysis.

Once hired Marla and Lee's clients only incur a fee if savings are found for the client. The services provided to the client entail making

changes in service, monitoring bills and continuing to look for errors on the client's monthly statements and service contracts. They have already saved tens of thousands of dollars for businesses and organizations. Here is a brief overview of their report for B'nai Sholom:

- 1. For all land line, cell phone, and internet service, a savings of about \$123 per month were found, which is a 43% savings from what we are currently paying.
- 2) Our current contract for land line and internet expires in 2015. However we will be signing a new contract with the new pricing for 12 months. We were on the Frontier Business Nation Unlimited plan, paying \$159.84 for phone, internet, fees and taxes. Immediately, upon board approval, Marla and Lee switched us to the recommended plan, Frontier Simply Unlimited for a total monthly cost of \$102.84. We stayed with Frontier and are receiving the same services and speed of internet but for less money per month.
- 3) The other savings found entailed the Rabbi's cell phone. The Rabbi's phone is with AT&T. The Nation 900 Rollover plan her phone was on, cost us \$126 per month. To save money we will be switching the phone to the AT&T Mobile Share Value plan that Marla and Lee recommended. We will continue to keep the Rabbi's phone off a contract as prices are lower that way. The new price includes 1 gigabyte of data and will now cost us \$59. That is a 53% savings.

Again, thank you Marla and Lee for sharing your new venture and knowledge with us. So glad we took you up on your offer to help us. Hopefully others who read this will call you to help them.
