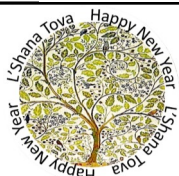

FROM THE RABBI

You stand today – ALL of you – before Adonai, your God...

Deuteronomy 29:9

“Did you see what is in the sanctuary?”

“The electric piano that Mac and Dave’s lent to us for the High Holy Days? Yes, I did! I am so excited that we will have even more sounds of music to sanctify our prayers.”

“Oh, I didn’t mean THAT, I meant that ramp thing.”

“Isn’t it amazing that we finally have access onto the bima for EVERYONE in our congregation? Aliyahs all around!”

“But don’t you think it mucks up the look of the place? What about aesthetics, the beauty of our sanctuary?”



It is a beautiful space. Its original emphasis was not on inclusion. The space was designed to inspire awe. That is why we love it so much for the High Holy Days, when awe is what we’re aiming for. The bima was built up high with steps leading up to it so that the Rabbi and the Congregation’s Officers could be respected – even more than that – that going up to the Torah could be a physical re-enactment of climbing Mt. Sinai. That’s what “aliyah” means: going up. Going up to the bima for any honor, whether it be opening the Ark, saying a blessing for the Torah reading, or any of a number of ways we include people in our service. Now we can include everyone, thanks to Mitch Klein.

Someone told me recently, how several men lifted an especially honored member in his wheelchair up the back steps so that he could enter the bima through the side door and have a pulpit honor. That was lovely! There are more people to honor than we have energy to do that for, though. We have given honors to people unable to make the stairs in recent years, and I’ve simply brought the microphone down to the main floor. But this year, anyone can come up. When I first saw that ramp – in its raw state, just two-by-fours and plywood – tears came to my eyes. We are walking the walk. (Just so you know, nothing’s permanent. The ramp can be removed in a couple of hours, if need be.)

This year when we read in the Torah, “You stand here today, all of you, before Adonai your God...” we will have a little more integrity than we did before. We have made it so all of us can go up to the Torah to honor and to be honored.

I recently watched an Eli Talk online, by Pamela Schuller, who is nationally known as an inclusion advocate (Elitalks.org/i-am-here-hear-me-bark-comedy-disability-and-inclusive-synagogue). One of the things she encouraged her listeners to do is to say, “Yes, and...” In other words, to take what is presented to you in a given situation and go with it. Try a positive spin and see what happens. The point is not to ignore things that are wrong, but to accept people and things for the positive gifts they have to offer.

So when you come in the sanctuary this year, and see the accessibility ramp, please pause and say, “Yes!” Then join me in thanking God for all the people who are working so tirelessly, volunteering their time, to make our congregation a stronger, brighter, and more beautiful place.

May you be inscribed and sealed for a good and a sweet, sweet year.

Friendly Reminder: High Holy Day Service Courtesies

The High Holy Days: Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur are almost upon us this year. We look forward to seeing all of you and your families at the upcoming services to celebrate, pray and connect with friends, family and fellow members of our Jewish community.

We welcome you and want to remind you of the need to be respectful and considerate of others. This applies to both adults and children. Please refrain from excessive talking and other noise or conduct that might be disruptive or otherwise interfere with others' participation in and enjoyment of services.

Please turn off all cell phones and pagers before entering services and limit the number of times you enter and leave the sanctuary during services. When entering or leaving is necessary, please avoid walking in front of the bima.

Whenever possible, enter or exit from the back or side of the sanctuary. Also, please do not enter or exit the Sanctuary while the Ark is open, which is usually the case when you see people standing.

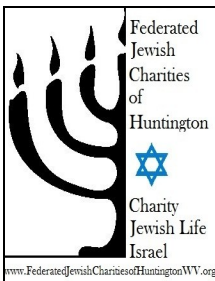

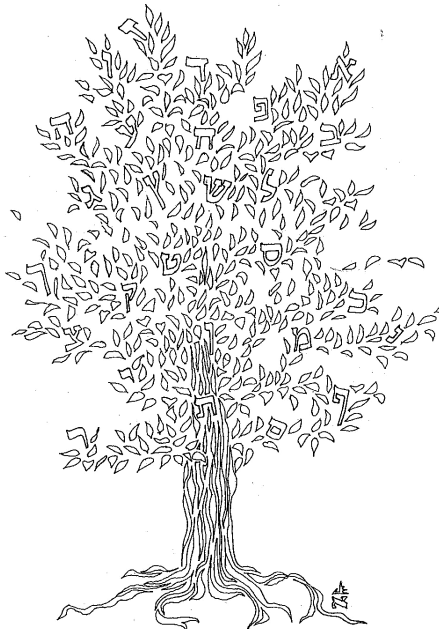
